WEEKLY TIDINGS: MARCH 31 - APRIL 7, 2019

Hello and welcome to Good Shepherd! We're glad you're here! May you experience the love of Christ and feel His presence during worship today.

FROM A VALLEY OF DRY BONES TO A VAST ARMY OF GOD - MISSION 51/49 - IT'S NOT BUSINESS; IT'S PERSONAL

Hopefully you are recognizing these three signposts on this Journey to the open tomb. I suggest that we take a moment to begin weaving them together. As I write this, know that these are only words printed on a page. Not until these words become flesh and bone, moved by the Spirit, do they carry any real weight. But as I write this I am reminded of Ezekiel's words, "And as I prophesied, there was a sound, and behold, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone."

And so I speak out to you to lean into these powerful words of God spoken through the voice of Ezekiel. Together we allow him to speak amazing, miraculous, God given life into us. And as we draw in that breath of the Spirit of Christ, together we stand as *an exceedingly great army*. If we are who God says we are, we are more than a friendly, little, family church located on Maxwell Drive in the South Hills. WE ARE an exceedingly great army. ... **Do you believe?** 

If we are that exceedingly great army then *Mission 51/49 - 2019* is not *Mission Impossible*, but rather mission attainable through the strength of Jesus and the leading of the Spirit. We no longer vaguely hope we can impact lives for Jesus, but we go together as warriors, having put on the armour of God, to take our stand against the evil one. And breaking down strongholds, freeing people for the glory of our God. ... **Are you in?** ... **All in?** 

So we ask you to *pray in the Spirit* to see if, and how exceedingly great, God is calling you to commit dollars, pesos, yen, gold or silver to bolster these people and ministries. Don't force it, wait for the Lord to direct. Tune your ears to His voice.

That is the business part. Personal business, but business nonetheless. For some of you, God is calling you to get your hands in the dirt, and meet people in the flesh. He is calling you to look in their eyes and speak face to face. "It's Personal!" If you don't believe me, then I invite you to walk to the foot of the cross. First look down in humble reverence. Then slowly lift your eyes. Don't rush past the feet. See the spike, driven through, holding his feet in place. Take note of the blood dripping from his body. Did you notice the flesh ripped from his ribs? Lips, parched, cracked, bleeding. Now look him in the eyes. Look close. Look deep. ... It IS personal. It is personal for Jesus. Is it personal for you?

Today, we hear from Rev. Reholma McCants. I assure you, for him, it is very personal. He has given years of his life to the children on the streets. I don't see him holding much back, he is all in. And he is helping us to touch them. Is God asking you for **your** reach? Do you see the child in need of a loving touch? Will you be the person to expend a few hours to give to these young children? ... This is where it gets personal. Be Blessed .... And be the blessing.
