From the Pastor's Desk

Ugly Beauty

Being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death – even death on a cross! -Philippians 2:8

The cross is in. It is everywhere – in all shapes and sizes. It is fashionable to wear it and display it. You can buy it studded with diamonds or rubies. Crosses can be beautiful!

It wasn't always so. In fact, Paul likely gritted his teeth as he wrote the words, "even death on a cross!" Paul and those to whom he wrote know too much about crosses. They had seen too much agony, too much humiliation, to think of the cross as beautiful.

To first-century eyes, the cross was ugly. In the minds of his followers, the last thing Jesus should have endured was the shame of the cross. Our Lord, however, has a strange and wonderful way of transforming things. He takes an ugly thing like the cross and makes it a matter of joy and pride.

The cross of our Savior does this for you and me. The Bible promises, "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow" (Isaiah 1:18). What a great image! Snow has a wonderful way of transforming a drab winter landscape, creating in its place a winter wonderland. Similarly, the love of Jesus covers over the ugliness of our sin. His grace changes everything – and not just on the surface, but all the way to the heart. He changes us inside and out.

What is it that makes you feel ugly inside right now? The power of the cross can transform it. An old hymn expresses this wonderfully:

The old rugged cross,
stained with blood so divine,
Such a wonderful beauty I see;
For 'twas on that old cross
Jesus suffered and died,
To pardon and sanctify me.
So I'll cherish the old rugged cross,
Till my trophies at last I lay down;
I will cling to the old rugged cross,
And exchange it someday for a crown.

A crown and a cross! Together, these tell the story of our salvation. My dad and mom's gravestone bears both a crown and a cross, along with the words "I know that my Redeemer lives" (Job 19:25). It reminds me that the cross brings beauty even to the ugliness of death.

Pastor's Note 1

The President's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Did your Parents ever tell you, "it's time we had the talk"? Well, it's time. At our monthly Church Council Meetings we always review the Financial Statements and the Distribution of Giving. We budgeted last year under the assumption that we would have a full time Pastor. Our expenses are currently lower than expected because we are in a vacancy period. Yet, we are still running about 8% below our anticipated income level. Yes, we do pay Pastor Adam and Pastor Barry for their support, but the cost is significantly less than a full time Pastor. Our expected income each week is \$6,136. We are very transparent about this. The actual income received is published in the bulletin each week. Rarely do we exceed the weekly budgeted income. Often contributions range between \$2,000 and \$4,000. Obviously it is difficult to run the Church if we can't support our anticipated expenses.

No one likes to talk about money; especially under these types of circumstances. But, money is integral to everything we do in life including supporting our Church. We do have other income sources; the Preschool, the organizations that use our facilities, rentals, etc. We take those all into account when we're managing our budget.

The reason I'm using this newsletter article to address our financial shortfall is that we are starting the Call process in earnest. A new Pastor is going to expect to come into a Church that can afford to pay him and provide benefits to support his Family. Good Shepherd will be more attractive to a new Pastor if we are in a positive financial condition and not in a deficit spending mode.

So, I am kindly asking that you reflect on your giving situation, pray about it, and if it is possible to increase your regular contribution, please consider doing so. If it is not, don't. Absent a large windfall legacy gift, the best way for us to address this specific issue going forward is to increase attendance. We're currently averaging 58 people per week average attendance. So pray also about bringing someone new to Church. Invite them to come and worship, participate in activities. Encourage them to consider joining our Good Shepherd Family.

I have faith that the Lord will continue to guide us and provide for us. But I also believe the Lord gave us many individual and collective talents, and we have to apply them to accomplish our Mission and Ministry.

On Easter Sunday, my Offertory Prayers was: "Dear Heavenly Father, We are filled with humility and praise dear Lord at the incredible gift you gave that we celebrate today, the gift of eternal salvation. Our gifts pale in comparison to all we've been given. Yet we pray dear Lord that these gifts honor you and that we effectively use them, wisely, to honor You and to do Your Will in Your Kingdom here on Earth...In Jesus Name, Amen"
