## From the Pastor's Desk

#### Seek His Face

"Give thanks to the Lord, call on his name; make known among the nations what he has done. Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts. Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice. Look to the Lord and his strength; seek his face always." (Psalm 105:1-4)

A few years ago, Andie and I had the chance to go to South Dakota. It is a land that in its barren wilderness, there is a beauty that is hard to describe.

While in South Dakota, we of course made the journey to see Mount Rushmore.

The four figures carved in stone on Mount Rushmore express the first 150 years of United States history. Why these four? The nation was guided by the vision and leadership of George Washington. Thomas Jefferson expanded our understanding of what it meant to be a nation, first in the Declaration of Independence and then in his vision of expanding our boundaries from coast to coast. Abraham Lincoln was not only a great leader, but he preserved the union while preserving the freedom and equality of all people. Theodore Roosevelt is the face most people have a hard time recalling when asked to recite from memory the four names of Mt. Rushmore. Theodore Roosevelt was the president who, at the turn of the twentieth century, saw the vision of America in the world community, as it moved from a rural republic to a world power.

Mount Rushmore represents one of the largest works of art on earth. Each face is 60 feet high. Compare that to the head on the Statue of Liberty which measures out at 17 feet tall. The nose of each president is 20 feet long and the mouth is 18 feet wide. If the entire body had been carved, the figures would have been 465 feet tall.

Looking at the faces of Mt. Rushmore creates a certain awe and wonder within a person, both in the work of art itself and in the memory of the four individuals it represents.

However, neither Mt. Rushmore, nor the faces it displays can come even close to inspiring me or changing my life as does the face of Jesus. These four men accomplished great things. But, who is like our God? Who has done the wonderful things that He has accomplished? This is the tone and attitude of the Psalmist as he writes Psalm 105. He is remembering all that God has done and is doing and his response is to say to all "Look to the Lord and his strength; seek his face always." (Psalm 105:4)

"Seek His face always!" In our common fellowship, in our appreciation of the awesome world He has created and above all in His Word and Sacrament, let us seek His face continually. This is His will. This is His pleasure. This is how our heart, mind and soul are wired. Let us seek His face, not because of what we shall gain from it but rather for the sheer love and praise of Him. In the glorious moments of life, as well as the moments when God seems to be hiding, let us seek His face.

"The Lord looks down from heaven on the sons of men to see if there are any who understand, any who seek God." (Psalm 14:2)

Today, as I was composing this monthly update, the Eastern District issued us a new call list of five pastors. The committee will meet soon to discuss this list and determine what comes next.
